- A public hearing was held on December 18, 2018 to consider changes to the Rusk County Code of Ordinances including definition updates, setting a minimum size for campgrounds to 5 acres, incorporating the Letter of Map Revision for the Amacoy Lake Levee, including changes to the mapped floodplain and revising the administration of the Nonmetallic Mining Reclamation Ordinance from Zoning to Land and Water Conservation.
