## All items can go in one bin!

### ACCEPTABLE ITEMS

#### PAPER/CARDBOARD

Any "paper" item **MUST** be at least 4" in at least 1 dimension

- ♻ Corrugated Cardboard (flattened)
- ♻ Paperboard (not food tainted)
- ♻ Brown Paper Bags
- ♻ Magazines, Catalogs & Newspapers
- ♻ Office Paper, Envelopes & Junk Mail
- ♻ Shredded Paper (must be in closed paper bag)
- ♻ Phone Books (don't need to remove cover)
- ♻ Paperback Books, Empty Paper Towel & Toilet Paper Rolls
- ♻ Milk, Juice, Broth and Soup Cartons (clean & empty)

#### GLASS/METAL/PLASTIC

- ♻ Aluminum Cans
- ♻ Clean Aluminum Foil (balled up) & Pie Tins
- ♻ Glass Bottles & Jars
- ♻ Metal Cans (food metal only)
- ♻ Plastic Bottles & Containers any # 1, 2 & 5 ONLY (Bottles, Jars, Jugs & Tubs)

#### PREPARATION

- ☺ Rinse food from all containers, bottles & jars
- ☺ Items must be loose and not in plastic bags
- ☺ No need to remove labels
- ☺ Break down all large items to maximize space (cardboard no greater than 3' x 3')
- ☺ No liquids – please keep items clean & dry
- ☺ Separate caps or lids on glass bottles or jars – put them in a tin can, crimp shut, then recycle
- ☺ Lids can be left on clean & empty bottles & jars

#### NOT-ACCEPTABLE

- ☹ Plastic Bags / Plastic Wrap or Film
- ☹ Ceramic, Porcelain, Pyrex or Crystal Glass
- ☹ Food Waste, Food-tainted Paper, Liquids
- ☹ Styrofoam Cups & Containers
- ☹ Napkins, Tissues, Paper Towels
- ☹ Hazardous Waste Containers/Needles/Syringes
- ☹ Scrap Metal, Batteries or Electronics
- ☹ Clothing, furniture or carpet
- ☹ Large plastic items > 3 gallons

**Who is required to recycle in WI?** Everyone, everywhere, all the time! Wisconsin's recycling requirements apply to everyone in the state, at all locations. This includes schools, public places, businesses, special events, homes and apartments.

Members of the Rusk County Responsible Unit may use ANY of the above listed sites for recycling services. The Rusk County RU consists of most of Rusk County except Villages of Tony & Weyerhaeuser; Towns of Big Falls, Dewey and Grow.

**RECYCLING SITES ARE FOR RESIDENTIAL USE ONLY!**

Contact your municipality officials to find out where to bring your garbage, what the costs are, and if they have a spring or fall cleanup.

## TOP RECYCLING CONTAMINANTS

**Sharps & Bio-Hazardous Waste:** Includes syringes and needles, diapers & other sanitary products. These are dangerous & put staff at risk.

**Plastic Film & Bags:** Recycle them locally. Visit [plasticfilmrecycling.org](http://plasticfilmrecycling.org) to learn more.

**Materials in Plastic Bags:** Workers have to slow the conveyor belts to rip open bags that contain recyclables and then add the bag to the heap of bags bound for the landfill. The bags contaminate materials and waste time & money.

**Shredded Paper:** It's too small to sort. Place it in a paper bag, fold it over a few times and staple bag shut to keep materials inside and place in bin.

**Scrap Metal:** Do not place in bin no matter what size. These items cause excessive damage to the recycling equipment - recycle locally.

**Hazardous Waste:** Bring to annual Clean Sweep. Discard hazardous waste containers.

**Electronics:** These are landfill banned but DO NOT belong in your bin. Recycle them locally.

**Liquids:** When bottles are compacted for shipping, liquids drip, splatter and explode all over the floor, creating a sticky, smelly mess on the sorting floor. Please completely empty and quickly rinse out all containers before recycling.

**Ceramics or Non-Recyclable Glass:** Ceramic, china, dishes, mirrors, light bulbs, Pyrex<sup>®</sup>, porcelain and window glass should NOT go in the bin. Their different melting points and chemical compositions will ruin new glass bottles.

**Large plastic items:** Recycle plastics by shape: bottles, jars, jugs and tubs. No plastic toys, laundry baskets, totes or items greater than 3 gallons.

**PLEASE do not put any non-acceptable items in your bin. Call the Recycling Dept. at 715-532-2167 if you have any questions on what is and isn't recyclable.**
