

## CJCC Minutes via Zoom

May 19, 2022

Present: Dave Willingham, Lori Gorseger, Judge Anderson, Jessica Flater-Kropidlowski, Melissa Buesgen, Patti LeMay, Rich Green, Cassandra Clark, Annette Barna, Jeff Wallace, and Jeremy Jacobs.

Meeting called to order by Jeremy Jacobs at 7:30 AM with the Pledge of Allegiance.

**Minutes:** Judge Anderson made a motion to approve April minutes. Seconded by Rich Green. No discussion. Motion carried unanimously.

**Purpose and Goals:** Jeremy indicated he researched other CJCCs. Jeremy pointed out that our CJCC does come together and we do share information, which is a good thing. A discussion was held on what our CJCC is doing now and what do we want to do in the future. Judge added we all need to be “collaborating”. Melissa added the importance of our CJCC having more defined goals. Jeremy asked that each subcommittee come to the June CJCC meeting with their committee’s goals.

Dave suggested it may be helpful if our CJCC looked at a case (real or fiction) and analyzed what worked and what didn’t work. This could help each part of the system understand what the other person/agency does and why.

Jeremy reported the Youth subcommittee met and discussed least invasive intervention with our youth. The Youth subcommittee was invited to participate in Truancy Court on June 1 starting at 3:00 p.m. A discussion will be held on the evidence based treatment for the participants.

Jeremy questioned what is the purpose of our subcommittees and what should they be doing. What direction do we as a CJCC want to go? Judge added the Data subcommittee is looking for guidance from the CJCC team as a whole. The data committee would like direction as to what data needs to be collected and why are we collecting it.

**Bylaws:** Everyone has a copy of the Bylaws. Please review and in June bring back any questions or suggestions.

**Drug Court update:** Patti is working on getting the Core Program caught up. She recently attended a Drug Court conference in the Dells. There are participants in Drug Court doing very well. There are currently six participants. In response to a question, Patti reported that participants complete Community Service (CS) hours as part of a sanction. Annette added participants can also pay for the drug court costs via CS. Jeremy would be willing to supervise the CS of cleaning the county cars if there is interest. Rich stated he may have participants from RRYP that may need to complete CS and could clean county cars. Jeremy also wondered if there could be coordination to clean up our ditches in the county as part of CS.

**Probation/Parole:** Rolling out a new revocation process. This will be a new format for the Courts. Melissa will provide an update at the June meeting.

**RRYP:** Cases are steady and consistent. MRT proceeding well. Rich gave a brief explanation of MRT. He plans to hold Prime for Life in July.

**Embrace:** Yoga in Park starting every Tuesday in June at 4:00 PM. They are giving a presentation at Flambeau Correctional today on transitioning into the community. They are working with their clients on stable suitable housing.

**RCSD:** Jail steadily housing around 40 inmates.

**Jeremy:** COVID numbers are up. Any questions contact public health.

**Court:** Judge attended criminal law and sentencing conference. The Judges were informed at the conference that some counties are having their DNA samples returned to the jails because booking was not completed. Judge will check with our jail on the status of our DNA testing. Judge will update CJCC at the June meeting.

**Rich Green:** He will be meeting with Ladysmith School about compliance on Ch. 118.
