

MINUTES  
CJCC MEETING  
January 21, 2021  
Meeting held via Zoom

Present were: Jeremy Jacobs, Karie Kennedy, Judge Anderson, Holly Parker, Mark Schmitt, Rich Green, Dave Willingham, Jessica Flater, George Murray, Judge Stewart, Laurie Leaf, Cassandra Clark, Andy Albarado.

The meeting was called to order by Chair Jeremy Jacobs with the reciting of the Pledge of Allegiance at 7:33 a.m.

A motion to approve prior month minutes was made by Judge Stewart. Second by Jessica Flater. Carried unanimously.

- Jeremy thanked those who attended the Truancy meeting with the area schools on January 12, 2021. Rich Green gave an overview of what was discussed. Judge Anderson feels it would be beneficial to have elementary students in Truancy Court. Jessica stated that the Ladysmith School will be discussing the truancy plan with the area schools.
- Judge Anderson gave an overview of the TAD report from 2018 that was emailed to the members of CJCC last month. Judge Stewart feels it is more of a report on a specific date and time. He would like the report to evaluate more of the program's overall effectiveness. Dave and Judge Stewart both agree there is funding set aside to conduct this type of evaluation.
- Holly stated the Drug Court participants are way down, but there are more being accepted into the program. Judge Anderson added that almost every penny of the grant for 2020 was spent. He's hoping to get the participant list back up so that the money can be spent, as that is what is expected. Holly has three participants that have graduated from Drug Court that still need to have a graduation party, but due to Covid they've been postponed.
- Judge Stewart is asking all members of CJCC to report next month on how they are doing with their committees. He would like to hear what the priorities are for each committee. Please email Jeremy if you're unsure of the committee you are on.
- Jeremy asked Karie to forward an email to everyone regarding the COVID-19 vaccine for patients 65 and older. If anyone has any questions, please call 715-532-2218. There is also a lot of funding that needs to be used up for fuel assistance. If anyone is interested they should call Becky Tucker at 715-532-2299.
- George gave an update on the jail. There are currently 32 inmates. They've been fairly busy because things are pretty much back to "business as usual". They are not taking anyone with a child support warrant or a municipal warrant at this time.
