

MINUTES
CJCC MEETING
September 17, 2020
Meeting held via Bluejeans and In Person

The meeting was called to order by Chair Jeremy Jacobs with the reciting of the Pledge of Allegiance at 7:30 a.m.

A motion to approve prior month minutes was made by George Murray. Second by Kevin Julien. Carried unanimously.

- George gives overview of what is happening in the jail along with the number of people that are currently incarcerated. The jail is still only taking in some offenders due to Covid-19. There haven't been any positive cases of Covid in the jail yet. George has been working closely with Public Health since the virus started and will continue to do so. Stephannie also gives an overview of what probation is doing, and states they are very cautious of who they bring into the jail.
- Melissa Detlaff gives an overview of how the Bruce School is doing during this time. She feels that the first two weeks went well, but now the kids are having some emotional problems because they want school to return back to normal, like it was before Covid.
- Rich Gauger gives an update on RRYP. MRT will start up for five of the Drug Court participants. He is also looking for volunteers for RRYP (Teen Court) ages 12-17. Melissa will help spread the word to Bruce students.
- Holly gives an update on Drug Court as there will be a few more participants joining soon. She is asking the Sheriff and his staff for more representation on team meetings, ect. Jeff said that he's been busy and will try attend when he can. Annette explains the match process in detail, and states why the Sheriff plays an important role in Drug Court.
- Jeremy Jacobs would like to spread the word about the energy assistance program. He states that the program has gotten even better with a significant amount of money due to Covid. He is telling others to call Becci Tucker to get more information and fill out an application. Meals on Wheels has opened back up. If anyone is interested they should contact Kay Stewart at 715-532-2176. They are also doing Grab-N-Go and Dinning at 5:00 as well.

- Dave Willingham informs everyone that the budget process is coming to a close. He feels that the revenue is a huge concern due to the mill closing in Wisconsin Rapids. Dave thinks there will be some major issues in 2022. He feels that we are going to need to defend ourselves and the programs that we believe in. He would like to see a performance evaluation done. Dave and Judge Stewart feel that the members of CJCC need to get a coordinated plan before resources are lost. This will be on next month's agenda.
