

The camp is the ideal location for your group's next retreat, conference, workshop, graduation, family reunion, or wedding. The camp offers plenty of space for indoor and outdoor activities.*

Camp History

- Hundreds of years of Native American travel had made a known trail along the west side of the Chippewa River through today's Trail's End Camp.
- With the Homestead Act of 1862 settlers traveling along the old native trails would improve the road width to accommodate wagons and teams.
- This improved road through Trail's End existed by 1875 and was known as the "Chippewa Trail"
- Sam and Sarah Johnson claimed the land for their own in 1874.



Camp History

- In 1881 the Big Bend Stage Line was built for people to travel from Chippewa Falls to a trading post 88 miles north. The line passed through Trail's End Camp and is still partially visible today.



Camp History



- In 1886 the Arpin Hardwood Lumber Company purchased the land for logging and used the river to move them. By 1900 all of the trees had been cut down and the land remained empty and unused.
- In 1928 the County of Rusk purchased the land.

Camp History

- In 1933, Claude Ebling, Rusk County Agent, took a plan to the Rusk County Commissioners to deed 86.1 acres of the land to the Rusk County 4-H Committee for use by Rusk County 4-H & FFA Clubs.
- The resolution passed unanimously.



Camp History

- The summer of 1934 was the beginning of camp activities – nearly 600 people showing for this first official club outing.
- A daily newspaper called the “Trails End Echoes” was printed daily to report the camp activities.

Camp History

- In 1959 the camp expanded from 86 acres to 149.5 acres. Improved bridges were built and new larger buildings were added to provide food and entertainment to campers.
- In 2018 received a 40 acre donation from James Hurley
- Camp is now 189.5 acres




Camp History

- In 1967, written policies were established as to who should govern the operation of Trail's End.
- The Rusk County Agriculture Committee was given the authority to appoint six trustees to administer the camp.
- The Trustees are known as the Trail's End Trustees and there are currently representatives today from 4-H, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, ICAA Youth Programs, local schools, DNR, Public Citizen and the Justice, Youth & Extension Committee.



Private Use Overnight Information

- “Private Use” are groups that DO NOT provide a planned program of recreation or education. Those that do must follow the guidelines for rec/ed camps.
- Private users can use the lodging facilities. Up to 3 tents and/or tents or RVs are allowed. More than 3 require a temporary campground license. Cabin capacity is listed in all cabins and must be followed.
- There is a full commercial kitchen available for your use but there is no serving of food to the public.
